The Guildhall is a stunning Georgian building housing the City's council offices and situated in the very heart of Bath. It was built between 1775 and 1778 by Thomas Baldwin, to designs by Thomas Warr Attwood. It has been designated as a Grade I Listed Building. The current Bath stone building replaced a Stuart Guildhall, built in 1625, which itself replaced an earlier Tudor structure. The facade has 4 iconic columns and the building is surmounted by the figure of Justice. The central dome was added in 1893. It forms a continuous building with the Victoria Art Gallery and the covered market.

The chapel is paved with Wombeyan marble and furnished in Blackbean wood from Australia. The paired Perpendicular style windows are glazed with arms of the Federal Government and the six Australian States, who contributed to this memorial.

The Great Octagon Room, Bath Assembly Rooms, Bennett Street, Bath

Hosted by the Chairman of Bath & Northeast Somerset Council

The Assembly Rooms are owned by the National Trust but are managed on their behalf by Bath & North East Somerset Council. The Assembly Rooms are a stunning Grade I listed building, dating to 1771. Adorned with the original Whitefriars crystal chandeliers and housing portraits by Gainsborough, Ramsey and Hoare. The Admiral would have visited on many occasions.

Number 1 Royal Crescent

(a 10 minute walk from The Assembly Rooms)



No.1 Royal Crescent is a Georgian town house that creates a wonderfully vital picture of life in Georgian Bath. Built between 1767 and 1774 to the designs of the architect John Wood the Younger, the Royal Crescent is justly considered one of the finest achievements of 18th century urban architecture and represents the highest point of Palladian architecture in Bath. No.1 was the first house to be built in the Crescent and originally provided luxury accommodation for the aristocratic visitors who came to take the waters

and enjoy the social season.

Henry Sandford was the first resident of this wonderful Georgian House. He lived there from 1776 until his death in Bath in 1796. Recent research has greatly improved our understanding of who Henry Sandford was and how he might have lived in this house. The museum has used these details to bring the house to life.

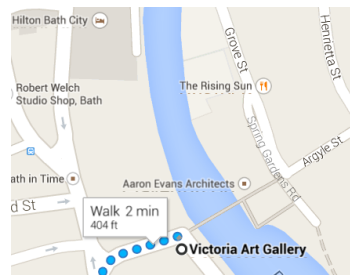

The Victoria Art Gallery is run by Bath and North East Somerset Council. It was designed in 1897 by John McKean Brydon, and is designated as a Grade II listed building. The exterior of the building includes a statue of Queen Victoria, by A. C. Lucchesi, while the upstairs picture gallery where the Wheatley hangs includes a cast of the Parthenon Frieze donated by Brydon.

The following programme, has been put together by the local Parish Council, especially for this visit.
Guests will be provided with a printed copy of the full arrangements on arrival.

10:30 am Lyndhurst visitors will be greeted by a Bell Ringing and then visit Appletree Court, New Forest District Council Offices for a celebratory tree planting.

Tea and coffee will be offered either at Appletree or at the New Forest Centre and Museum where the exhibition, "Celebrating Arthur Phillip" will be held. From there Costumed Guides will lead our guests on a short walk talking of the Lyndhurst Arthur Phillip would have known, The Verderers Court, Church, site of Blind House, stocks, barracks, Crown Inn, etc. to Lyndhurst Park (Glasshayes) and the Bench. Lime Wood although much altered, existed as Park Hill in Phillip's time so it would have been a house he knew on the edge of his land.

Moving on to Boldre and Boldre Church notable for its connections with Rev. Richard Johnson a former curate who travelled with the First Fleet taking Christianity, education and his farming knowledge to Australia. The school, founded by Rev William Gilpin, his mentor and friend still stands as a private house. Refreshments will be available. The visit is led by, Lt Col. Peter Chitty who has written a leaflet on Rev. Johnson. The church still conducts an Aussie Sunday remembering Rev Johnson first thanksgiving service on the beach.

Next stop is Lymington, a charming Georgian town. Phillip lived in the High Street with his second wife while he was in charge of the Fencibles and Impress Services. They were charged with protecting our coasts in the event of an invasion and providing men for the navy. There will be opportunities to explore the town, guided walks will be available, and there will be a small exhibition in Lloyds Bank.
